

Hawaii Baptist Academy Graduation Requirements

ENGLISH	Four units of credit, one each year, to include the following: English 9, English 10, English 11 <i>or</i> Advanced Placement (AP) English 11, and English 12 <i>or</i> AP English 12.
SOCIAL STUDIES	Four units of credit to include the following: Ancient World History 9 and Hawaiian History 9, U.S. History 10, Modern World History 11 <i>or</i> AP World History, Economics 12, and Political Science 12 <i>or</i> AP U.S. Government & Politics.
MATHEMATICS	Three units of credit to include one of the following sequences: Algebra 1-9, Geometry, and Algebra 2; <i>OR</i> Algebra 2-9, Geometry, and Pre-Calculus <i>or</i> Algebra 3/Trigonometry. <i>Beginning with the Class of 2013:</i> Three units of credit to include the following: Geometry, Algebra 2, and third-year mathematics elective (e.g. Algebra 3/Trigonometry, Algebra 3/Introduction to Statistics, Pre-Calculus).
SCIENCE	Three units of credit to include the following: Conceptual Physics, Biology, and Chemistry. <i>Beginning with the Class of 2013:</i> Three units of credit to include the following: Biology, Chemistry, and third-year science elective (e.g. Physics, Intro. to Forensics, AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Physics B).
BIBLE	Two units of credit, ½ unit each year at Hawaii Baptist Academy.
WORLD LANGUAGE	Two units of credit in the same world language, taken in two consecutive years.
PHYSICAL EDUCATION	One unit of credit, ½ unit each in grades 9 and 10 preferably and taken in two different school years.
COMMUNICATION SKILLS	One-half unit of credit in Communication Skills (grades 11 or 12).
LIFE SKILLS and SERVICE LEARNING	One-half unit of credit in Life Skills and Service Learning 11.
COMPUTER LITERACY	One-half unit of credit in Computer Applications.
VISUAL AND PERFORMING ARTS	One-half unit of credit in music, visual arts, or drama (theater).
ELECTIVE COURSES	Three units of credit. These can be additional courses beyond the requirement in any field.
<hr/> TOTAL	<hr/> Twenty-four units of credits. All units for graduation must be earned in grades 9-12. Transfer credits will be reviewed on an individual basis. <hr/>
